

HURRICANE FORECAST MAP

The National Hurricane Center plans to discourage people from putting too much faith in that skinny black line that was used by offering a **STRIKE PROBABILITY** map. The color-coded map will be posted on the center's website at WWW.NHC.NOAA.GOV by June 1 start of the season. It will display the odds that a given area could face hurricane or tropical winds. It will also attempt to project a storm's size and intensity. So when you go north and hear of a possible hurricane, go to this web site and see if we're going to get it. The Editor

You can also add a backflow prevention part to your water heater that will not require you to switch off the breaker each time. I have heard Glen Carson in Westwind II will install those for a reasonable price. John Schoen and I did an inspection on 10/18 and letters were sent to 28 residents with items that needed attention. Please take care of those as soon as possible or call the office if you need a little more time. Thank you to the majority of residents who keep their home looking so good all the time. Your pride of ownership shows. The 2018 Proposed Budget will be going out to all shareholders during the week of 10/23. If you have returned to the park, but have not notified me, your copy will be mailed to your alternate address. I will have extra copies in the office for those who don't get theirs. CHRISTMAS DECORATIONS


will be put up on Monday, November 28th with Mimi Chestnut as the coordinator. The volunteers should meet at the clubhouse about 9:00am.
